- ▶ On September 3, 2020, I was re-elected as Member of Parliament. I polled 4,510 votes to my opponent's 3,266 for a margin of 1,244 and representing 58% of the votes cast in the constituency



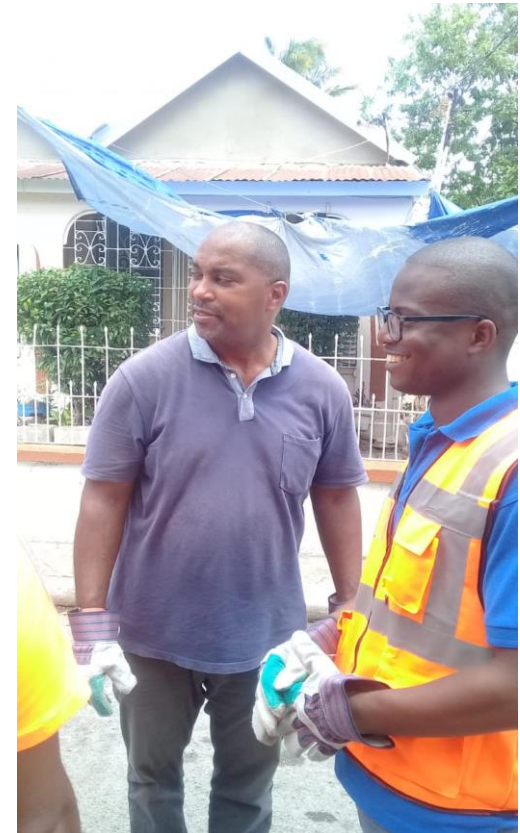
